

County Councillor's Report Roger Gough

In the last newsletter, I reported that we were close to the 20mph speed limit scheme being handed over to a delivery team and added that, while it was not then imminent, it was getting a lot closer. We now have a delivery date of 29/30 May, so it should be in place very shortly.



In recent months there have been a number of road closures in the village, reflecting both

highways' repairs (such as at Gildenhill Road) and various utility works (in particular on Highlands Hill). Some Thames Water works were completed a few weeks ago, and at the time of writing there is a Kent Highways closure (also on Highlands Hill) to replace a street lighting column due on 30 April. This will be between 9:30 and 2:30 to avoid an impact on school drop off and pick up, and many recent closures have similarly sought to avoid affecting this. (Closures related to the 20mph zone are scheduled for half term).

Kent Highways' pothole blitz has been under way since March, with an additional £8.6 million available for this financial year. This is on top of around £50 million committed to our maintenance budgets for roads and footways. After two winters which have severely affected our roads, we will need all this and more, but hopefully the effects of this investment will be seen over the coming weeks and months.

Message from Leader of Swanley Town Council



Sevenoaks District Council Local Plan

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, Sevenoaks District Council is producing its Local Plan, to state where new homes will be built in the District, as required to do so by Government. This is a key planning document about where the Council views housing development should go – but it doesn't prevent individual planning applications coming forward at some point in the future, being considered outside

of the Local Plan process.

Around 5,300 residents across the district responded to the consultation advertised in the In Shape magazine, which is delivered to every home in the district. The good news is that there are very few sites in Swanley's Green Belt that are at risk. This is a big change from six years ago where 3,000 houses were proposed on all the land between Swanley Village and Swanley. This plan will ensure this land is preserved for another generation.

Household Waste Recycling Centre Changes - some good news for once...!

Many residents may not know, but the Government has ensured Councils do not charge for certain household waste collections. This means that charges at the Swanley KCC Tip (the Teardrop Centre) have now been removed as of December 2023.

Items previously charged for such as rubble, breezeblocks, concrete, ceramic bathroom and kitchen items, plasterboard and tiles can now be deposited without charge. However, there are limits (which can be found on the booking website) and residents must ensure they meet them otherwise they may be charged.

The only thing to continue to be charged for is car or van tyres. Although this is to be welcomed, you may still wish to use waste clearance services. Please be very careful who you hire – all waste clearance services (van drivers etc) must have a waste carrier license. Always ask for this and take a picture of it, along with the vehicle should you use these services. Should your waste be found fly tipped down a country lane, you will be liable, and prosecutions have occurred – so please always check and document a waste carrier license before you agree for anyone to take your rubbish!

Spring Clean

I was delighted to join the Swanley Village Spring Clean, which is supported by Swanley Town Council and provides a skip for rubbish to be collected and taken away. I want to say a huge thank you to all volunteers in the village who gave up their time to litter pick across the village.

20 MPH Zone

Swanley Town Council is supporting the project to install a 20mph zone in Swanley Village. This will be paid for out of 'Community Infrastructure Levy' which is secured from developers when new homes are built, and this funding is coming from the Harrington's Nursery development at the bottom of Highlands Hill.




